• Responsibilities:

The Salvadoran Army focuses on preventive patrolling and internal security operations to combat gang violence and drug trafficking.

• Organizational Structure:

The primary combat capability of the army is provided by a single cavalry regiment with two maneuver battalions and the augmented battalion-size SF Command. Its five infantry brigades field 15 combat arms battalions. A single artillery brigade operates a mix of ageing 105 mm howitzers and 20 mm anti-aircraft cannons. There is also a Special Military Security Brigade with two military police and two border guard battalions that carry out essential security missions and can act as combat units. In April 2016, the government established a rapid reaction force consisting of 600 soldiers and 400 elite policemen to fight organized crime.

• Force Distribution:

The Salvadoran Army is organized along territorial lines, with units being deployed in the five (5) different military zones that divide the country.

All specialized units – the Cavalry Regiment, Artillery Brigade, Special Security Military Brigade, Engineering Command, Communications Command, and SF Command – are found within the First Military Zone, which covers the center of the country and the capital, San Salvador. Five (5) infantry brigades are spread among the four remaining military zones, one per zone, except for the Fifth Military Zone, which has two. Command of military zones is assumed by brigade commanders.

A number of company-sized military detachments are also found in the different military zones and fall under the command of the latter. The specialist units found in the First Military Zone can quickly deploy to other parts of the country to support the units found in a particular military zone. The structure is unlikely to undergo significant change because it enables efficient coverage of the Salvadoran territory.
